¹ For reporting journal prestige, SOC uses the 1-year Journal Impact Factor (JIF)—calculated by Clarivate Analytics’ Journal Citation Reports (JCR)—which is the most widely used impact factor system. JCR has the largest journal database, the longest time series for most journals, and a rigorous auditing system (for detecting and penalizing journals using bad practices to inflate their scores). Since some publishers do not always clearly display their current JIF on their journal’s website, **faculty should find a journal’s 1-year JIF in the JCR database—which is available through MSU Libraries or in the “InCites Journal Impact Factors for SOC” file.**

² For reporting publication citations, SOC uses Google Scholar, which is the most widely adopted citation database across social science generally and which is optimal for counting citations to books and book chapters specifically. Google Scholar updates citation counts in real-time and provides a scholar’s H-Index and i10-Index scores. **Faculty are strongly encouraged to create a Google Scholar Profile, which they carefully manage to include all of their publications and exclude any that are not theirs.**
